An opportunity exists for a Masters student in the Keays laboratory at the Institute of Molecular Pathology (IMP). The Keays lab is interested in understanding how animals detect magnetic fields at the cellular and molecular level, employing the pigeon as model system.

The successful applicant will be involved in a project that is focused on the role of the retina in magnetosensation. He/she will be exposed to a broad range of molecular techniques (cell culture, western blotting, cloning) with scope to undertake single cell transcriptomics analysis.

The ideal applicant will have an interest in neuroscience and experience in molecular biology. Passion and perseverance are essential attributes. The successful applicant will receive a monthly stipend.
